

Junior Members Code of Conduct for Rolleston CC

ROLLESTON CC is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the well-being of all its members.

ROLLESTON CC believes that it is important that members, coaches, administrators and parents/carers or guardians associated with the club should, at all times, show respect and understanding for the safety and welfare of others.

Therefore, members are encouraged to be open at all times and to share any concerns or complaints that they may have about any aspect of the club directly with the Chairman Mr. T. Foster, the Club Welfare Officer, Mrs Jane Yates, or through their team manager

Rolleston CC has a long and proud history in local cricket. You are expected to maintain its traditions of courteous behaviour and fair play by abiding by the following junior code of conduct:

All Junior Members of Rolleston CC will:

- Play within the rules and respect officials and their decisions
- Be courteous to coaches and other junior players and help promote an ethos of team work and encouragement.
- Keep to agreed timings for training and competitions or inform their coach or team manager if they are going to be late.
- Members must wear suitable kit — for training and match sessions, as agreed with the team manager.
- Members must pay any fees for training or events promptly.
- Junior members are not allowed to smoke whilst representing the club at competitions.
- Junior members are not allowed to consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the club premises or whilst representing the club.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person within the context of Cricket
- Treat everyone equally and not discriminate on the grounds of age, gender, disability, race, ethnic origin, nationality, colour, parental or marital status, religious belief, class or social background, sexual preference or political belief
- Display high standards of behaviour
- Promote the positive aspects of Cricket e.g. fair play
- Encourage all participants to learn the Laws and rules and play within them, respecting the decisions of match officials
- Actively discourage unfair play, rule violations and arguing with match officials
- Recognise good performance not just match results
- Follow ECB guidelines set out in the “Safe Hands – Cricket’s Policy for Safeguarding Children’ and any other relevant guidelines issued
